Health Care for Senior Trees

Mature Tree Care from A to Z

This seminar is designed to help you understand how trees age and teach the specialized treatments required to conserve old trees and prevent damage. Geriatric tree research shows mature trees age and decline through losing control of their resources and falling apart. Arborists can partially counter the aging effects by providing positive treatments that allow old trees to be successful and long lived.

Mature trees are different than younger trees in their response to environmental changes and resource availability. Different arboricultural practices are required to help maintain mature tree health and structural integrity. Old trees are more susceptible than younger trees to site constraints and injury. Tree health care management must account for the unique features and processes in older trees. Treatment prescriptions for pruning, fertilization, and prevention of injury will be highlighted. This seminar is designed to teach tree health care practitioners how to properly manage mature trees.
